ABOUT | Mikki Kendall (she/her) is a writer, diversity consultant, and occasional feminist, whose work has appeared in TIME, the New York Times, The Guardian, the Washington Post, Essence, Vogue, The Boston Globe, NBC, and elsewhere.

An accomplished public speaker, she has discussed race, feminism, violence in Chicago, tech, pop culture, and social media on The Daily Show, MSNBC, NPR, Al Jazeera's The Listening Post, BBC's Women's Hour, and Huffington Post Live, as well as at universities across the country. Mikki Kendall is the author of the New York Times-bestselling HOOD FEMINISM (recipient of the Chicago Review of Books Award and named a best book of the year by BBC, Bustle, and TIME). She is also the author of AMAZONS, ABOLITION-ISTS, AND ACTIVISTS, a graphic novel illustrated by A. D'Amico. In 2017, she was awarded Best Food Essay from the Association of Food Journalists for her essay on hot sauce, Jim Crow, and Beyoncé.

A veteran, Mikki Kendall lives in Chicago with her family.

Presentation by: Damaris Crocker De Ruiter (she/her/hers)


